

Exotic Beam Summer School 2015

2nd announcement

Dear Colleagues,

This year's Exotic Beam Summer School (EBSS) will be held on the campus of Florida State University, Tallahassee, Florida, August 2- August 7, 2015. Please pass on this notice to interested students and young researchers. As in previous years, the number of places will be limited to around forty participants who will be selected from the pool of applicants. For the accepted participants, the local costs in housing and food will be covered by the EBSS. The school is intended for graduate students, but senior undergraduates and junior post-docs will also be considered. As part of the process a letter from the supervisor of the applicant is required.

Applications will be accepted until May 1. Applicants will be notified if they have been accepted to the school by May 15.

This will be the fourteenth in the series of annual summer schools devoted to the exciting developments in the study of exotic nuclei. The school is jointly organized by ANL, LBNL, LLNL, MSU, ORNL and ARUNA. ARUNA, the Association for Research with University Nuclear Accelerators, has joined the group of organizing laboratories in 2014 and is hosting the conference for the first time. The John D. Fox accelerator laboratory at FSU will provide an excellent opportunity for hands-on experience to the school participants.

The school will comprise lectures each morning from August 3rd to August 7th, delivered by distinguished figures in the various sub-fields. In the afternoons, there will be hands-on activities, geared towards introducing fundamental techniques and methods in the production, detection, and investigation of exotic nuclei.
