Physics with Fragment Separators - 25th Anniversary of RIKEN Projectile Fragment Separator (RIPS25) December 6 –7, 2015

Shonan Village Center, Hayama, Kanagawa, Japan 1st circular

RIKEN Projectile-Fragment Separator, RIPS, at RIKEN started its physics programs using RI beams at intermediate energies in 1990. Since then, the RIPS facility has been pioneering in a variety of key experiments in RI-beam physics. This symposium will celebrate the great achievements that the RIPS has made for the last 25 years. The RIPS25 symposium will review how RI-beam physics has been established as one of the key fields of nuclear physics, and discuss the future directions of this field.

RIPS25 is jointly organized by RIKEN Nishina Center for Accelerator-Based Science and Center for Nuclear Study (CNS), Univ. of Tokyo, chaired by Toshiyuki Kubo (RIKEN) and co-chaired by Susumu Shimoura (CNS). The symposium will be held at Shonan Village Center, a scenic place with a nice viewpoint for Mt. Fuji, in the Miura Peninsula, located about 50 km south of Tokyo, and close to the historical city of Kamakura. The symposium will last two days from Sunday, December 6, to Monday, December 7, 2015. We will have a social dinner on Monday evening.
